

Watershed Action Program 2019 - 2020 Year in Review

In the 2019-2020 School Year:

- 745 Student Environmentalists took action to improve the health of their watershed
- Students cleaned up 20,615
 pieces of trash (424.2 gallons)

 from the watershed environment
- Students completed 1,012
 environmental stewardship hours
 to improve the health of their
 local watershed
- 124 student scientists learned how to make natural pesticides for their school and home gardens
- 26 teachers increased their confidence in using the local watershed as an educational resource
- 26 teachers received tailored Distance Learning lessons to complete the program after school closures
