



# **Storm Drain Rangers** 2021-2022

**Year in Review** 



- 399 students educated their communities about reducing storm drain pollution
- Student Environmentalists cleaned up 4,634 pieces of trash (249 gallons) from their local neighborhoods
- Student-led schoolwide assemblies inspired 268 students, 12 teachers and six school principals to protect the local watershed
- 399 families engaged in interviews about storm drain pollution prevention with their students
