Storm Drain Rangers 2022-2023 Year in Review



In the 2022-2023 School Year:

- 492 students created informational posters to educate their communities about reducing stormwater pollution
- Student Environmentalists cleaned up 7,005 pieces of trash (249 gallons) from their local neighborhoods
- Student leaders presented schoolwide assemblies to inspire peers, teachers, and principals from six different schools to protect their local watershed
- Over 400 families engaged in interviews about stormwater pollution prevention with their students
- 492 students became Storm Drain Rangers and pledged to make behavior changes to help the environment.

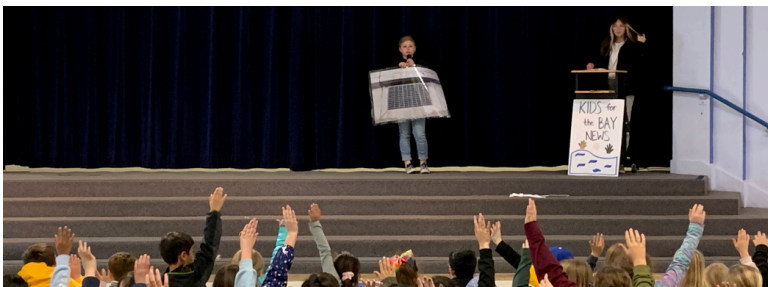
School Campus Clean Ups
