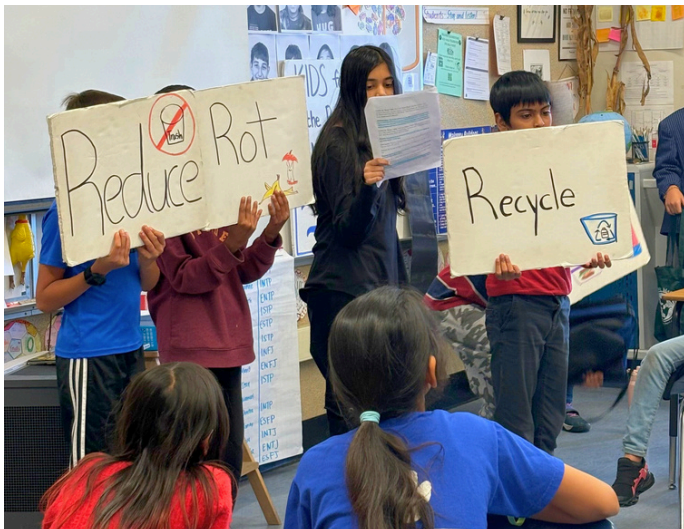




KIDS for the BAY

Storm Drain Rangers 2023-2024 Year in Review



In the 2023-2024 School Year:

- 384 students created informational posters to educate their communities about reducing stormwater pollution
- Student Environmentalists cleaned up 3,601 pieces of trash (251 gallons) from their local neighborhoods
- Student leaders presented schoolwide assemblies to inspire peers, teachers, and principals from six different schools to protect their local watersheds
- Over 300 families engaged in interviews about stormwater pollution prevention with their students
- 384 students became Storm Drain Rangers and pledged to make behavior changes to help the watershed environment.



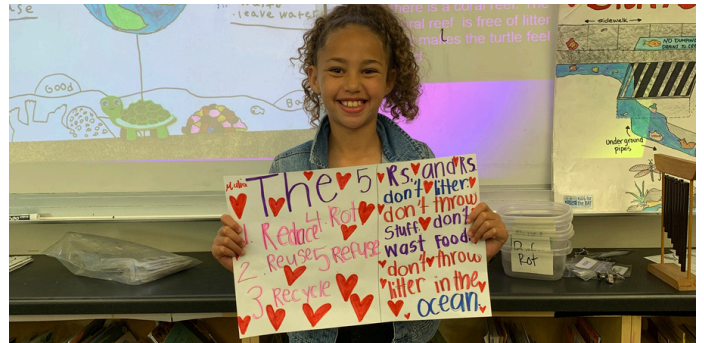
